General Information

- 1. NSSA Classification cards must be up to date prior to registration. Shooters who do not present an updated and complete classification card will shoot in Class I.
- 2. Parents or coaches are not allowed on the fields during the competition.
- 3. Competitors must be at their assigned field ready to shoot no later than fifteen (15) minutes prior to their scheduled shooting time. Squads will NOT be called. It is the responsibility of each competitor to be at the correct field at the correct time.
- 4. All prizes must be picked up at the shoot. No prizes will be mailed.
- 5. Protest Committee: The Protest Committee will consist of the Shoot Chairman, Chief Referee and a Terrell Rifle and Pistol Club Shotgun Director.
- 6. A skeet field and a sporting clays field will be available for practice at \$5 per box of shells.

Concurrent Competition Format

During most NSSA registered skeet events, competitors are placed in separate classifications (AAA, AA, AB, etc.) based on their target average in the event. The competitors can also compete based on concurrent status such as Sub-Junior, Junior, Lady and many others. NSSA awards All-American points for both open and concurrent performance. The concurrent All-American point system is based on the number of competitors competing in the same event in the same concurrent (Sub-Junior, Junior, etc.) At local skeet competitions, it is uncommon to have very many (Sub-Junior, Junior, etc.) competitors. This makes the North Texas Juniors Open a meaningful event in the selection of the Sub-Junior and Junior All-American teams. During the North Texas Juniors Open, competitors compete in their concurrent(s) only. For instance, Sub-Juniors will only compete against other Sub-Juniors. There is no competition between classes such as AAA, AA, A, B, etc. One special twist to the competition is that concurrent are classified by Class I and Class II or Class III based on their 12 Gauge target average. Sub-Junior and Junior class medals are awarded for first through third in each class. If there are any ties in score for Class I, II and III places, a shoot-off occurs to determine the winner.

Sub-Junior classifications (By Average) A Sub-Junior shooter is defined as a competitor that has not reached their 14th birthday by January 1st of the current shooting year and is a member of NSSA in good standing.

CLASS I 90.00 and over

CLASS II 80.00 - 89.99

CLASS III Under 80.00

Junior classifications (By Average) A Junior shooter is defined as a competitor that has not reached their 18th birthday by January 1st of the current shooting year and is a member of NSSA in good standing.

CLASS I 94.00 and over

CLASS II 90.00 - 93.99

CLASS III Under 90.00
